## Would you like to provide additional comments on the answers you have provided above?

Thank you for this opportunity and thank you to the the Cornerstone Association of REALTORS® for arranging it. As you may know, Mark Carney announced that a new Liberal government would build more homes that Canadians can afford, through Canada's most ambitious housing plan since the Second World War. In the face of President Trump's tariffs, we need to build for Canadians.

A Mark Carney-led Liberal government will double the pace of construction to almost 500,000 new homes a year, with a housing plan that will:

- Create Build Canada Homes (BCH) to get the federal government back into the business of home building;
- Make the housing market work better by catalyzing private capital, cutting red tape, and lowering the cost of homebuilding; and,
- Eliminating the Goods and Services Tax (GST) for first-time homebuyers on homes at or under \$1 million, saving families up to \$50,000.

Other parties are suggesting to cut policies that experts agree would build more homes such as the Housing Accelerator Fund, and let the market do the rest.
