Our Mark Carney led liberal team has put forward the most ambitious housing plan since the Second World War, increasing the pace of construction to build more homes that Canadians can afford while spurring a new industry that can take on the world.

We are going to get the federal government back into the business of homebuilding, while partnering with workers and industry, and cutting taxes for home buyers. We will:

- Create Build Canada Homes (BCH), a new entity that will act as a developer to build affordable housing at scale (including on public land); catalyze a new housing industry with over \$25 billion in financing for innovative prefabricated home builders in Canada, including those using Canadian technologies and resources like mass timber and softwood lumber; and providing \$10 billion in low-cost financing and capital to affordable home builders, \$6 billion of which will go towards fighting homelessness by rapidly building deeply affordable housing, supportive housing, Indigenous housing, and shelters.
- Make the housing market work better by cutting municipal development charges in half for multi-unit residential housing for five years while keeping municipal governments whole, reducing red tape, and reintroducing a major tax incentive which, when originally introduced in the 1970s, spurred tens of thousands of rental housing across the country.
- Eliminate the GST for first-time homebuyers on homes at or under \$1 million, saving Canadians up to \$50,000 on the purchase of their first home.
- Invest \$1 billion to make it easier for Canadians, including renters, to adopt efficient and affordable electric heating and cooling and energy efficiency retrofits such as new insulation, doors and windows, and to make homes more resilient to extreme weather such as floods and wildfires.
